OBJECTIVE

Improve the preparedness and capacity of hospital services at the Sint Maarten Medical Center, the only hospital on the island for the growing population

BENEFICIARIES

- ~60,000 residents of Sint Maarten, Saba, and St. Eustatius
- 2.6 million tourists that visit Sint Maarten annually and need medical services



1 Building and launching of the new hospital (\$24 million)

 Co-finance the turnkey contract for the design upgrade, construction, and launching of the new hospital.

2 Transition and contingency plan for Sint Maarten Medical Center (\$11.31 million)

- · Works and equipment needed for rehabilitation and upgrades.
- Technical assistance to support clinical guidelines, quality control mechanisms, and internal technical audits.
- Arrangements with partners for training of human resources.
- Support the accreditation process.
- Repair damages caused by Hurricane Irma.
- Increase the safety, preparedness, and resilience of current hospital.
- Expand the capacity of select services and create new services.
- · Expand the Intensive Care Unit and isolation capacity.
- Pilot the design of new patient and operating rooms to gain feedback from health providers and patients and identify best options.
- Incorporate medical equipment that is part of the new hospital contract to expand services, train staff, and test equipment quality.

3 Project management (\$300,000)

• Finance related operating expenses, equipment, and personnel.

Additional Financing I (\$3.61 million) approved August 26, 2020, included in Component 2.

Additional Financing II (\$7 million) approved August 22, 2023, included in Component 1.

\$35.61 millon from the World Bank-managed Trust Fund grant, with \$33 million in private loans from counterpart funding.
