OBJECTIVE

Improve the capacity of mental health service delivery in Sint Maarten

BENEFICIARIES

- Entire population of Sint Maarten (about 40,000)
- Ministry of Public Health, Social Development and Labor (VSA)
- Mental Health Foundation staff, mental health providers, and other frontline workers through training



1 Supporting the strengthening of the national mental health system (\$3.5 million)

- Support efforts related to mental health governance, financing, and service delivery along the full continuum of care.
- Includes training and education activities in organizations across
 the care continuum; addressing gaps in mental health service
 delivery; prevention and mental health promotion activities;
 and strengthening treatment protocols, referral protocols, and
 expertise within the mental health care chain.

Construction of a new Mental Health Foundation facility (\$4 million)

- Design of the new facility building, goods, and technical expertise.
 In the optimal scenario, the facility would include 10 clinic rooms, a low stimulus room, an isolation room, 6 long and short stay rooms, and 20 rooms for outpatient care, day treatment and offices.
- Civil works and supervision of works for the new facility. The civil works would occur in St. Johns Estate near the White and Yellow Cross Foundation.

3 Project management, monitoring, and evaluation (\$0.5 million)

- Finance the related administrative expenditures for project management to be carried out by the National Recovery Program Bureau and led by a project manager.
- Includes needed expertise in contract management, procurement, financial management, environmental and social standards, other technical matters, and monitoring and evaluation.
