OBJECTIVE

Repair roofs up to a safe standard for vulnerable households affected by Hurricane Irma

BENEFICIARIES

- Vulnerable households unable to repair and rebuild roofs themselves, including women-led households
- Cocal tradesmen trained and hired to help with roof repairs



COMPONENTS







Implemented by the Netherlands Red Cross

Roof repair of damaged houses (\$3.62 million)

Support repair of approximately 200 damaged roofs to safe standards. This is the only component of the project. Steps include:

- Area selection for repairs where there is still significant hurricane damage and people are struggling to rebuild.
- Beneficiary identification and selection by community mobilizers based on existing eligibility criteria of vulnerability and technical assessments.
- Measurement and distribution of bills of quantities and technical workshops that cover safe construction, principles of hurricane-resistant buildings, and reconstruction techniques as relevant.
- Roof repairs by construction crews trained and equipped with tools for repairs.
- Quality control of repairs according to reconstruction guidelines.
